The Board of Directors of the Denver Rock Drill Metropolitan District, Denver County, Colorado, held a special meeting via videoconference on November 19, 2021 at 1:00 pm.

Also in attendance were Alan Pogue, Icenogle Seaver Pogue, P.C.; Kammy Tinney, Casey Tighe, Luis Garcia, and Geol Scheirman; Pinnacle Consulting Group, Inc.

Ms. Tinney stated that proper publication was made to allow the Board to conduct a public hearing on the District's 2022 budget. Director Jeung opened the public hearing on the District's proposed 2022 budget. There being no public comment on the District's budget, the public hearing was closed.

Thereupon, Director Jeung introduced and moved the adoption of the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION SUMMARIZING REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES, ADOPTING A BUDGET, SETTING FORTH MILL LEVIES, AND APPROPRIATING SUMS OF MONEY TO THE GENERAL FUND IN THE AMOUNTS AND FOR THE PURPOSES SET FORTH HEREIN FOR THE DENVER ROCK DRILL METROPOLITAN DISTRICT, DENVER COUNTY, COLORADO, FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR BEGINNING ON THE FIRST DAY OF JANUARY 2022, AND ENDING ON THE LAST DAY OF DECEMBER 2022,

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Denver Rock Drill Metropolitan District has authorized its consultants to prepare and submit a proposed budget to said governing body at the proper time; and

WHEREAS, the proposed budget has been submitted to the Board of Directors of the District for its consideration; and

WHEREAS, upon due and proper notice, published on October 28, 2021, in the Denver Herald Dispatch, a newspaper having general circulation within the boundaries of the District, pursuant to statute, said proposed budget was available for inspection by the public at a designated public office, a public hearing was held on November 19th, 2021, and interested electors were given the opportunity to file or register any objections to said proposed budget; and

WHEREAS, whatever increases may have been made in the expenditures, like increases were added to the revenues so that the budget remains in balance, as required by law,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE DENVER ROCK DRILL METROPOLITAN DISTRICT OF DENVER COUNTY, COLORADO:

Section 1. 2022 Budget Revenues. That the estimated revenues for each fund as more specifically set out in the budget attached hereto are accepted and approved.

Section 2. 2022 Budget Expenditures. That the estimated expenditures for each fund as more specifically set out in the budget attached hereto are accepted and approved.

Section 3. Adoption of Budget for 2022. That the budget as submitted and attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, and if amended, then as amended, is hereby approved and adopted as the budget of the Denver Rock Drill Metropolitan District for calendar year 2021.

Section 4. 2021 Levy of General Property Taxes. That the foregoing budget indicated that the amount of money necessary to balance the 2022 budget for the General Fund

from property taxes for operating expenses is \$37,720. That the 2021 valuation for assessment, as certified by the Denver County Assessor, is \$96,090.

A. Levy for General Fund. That for the purposes of meeting all general operating expense of the District during the 2022 budget year, there is hereby levied a tax of 50.000 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation of assessment of all taxable property within the District for the year 2021.

Section 5. Property Tax and Fiscal Year Spending Limits. That, being fully informed, the Board finds that the foregoing budget and mill levies do not result in a violation of any applicable property tax or fiscal year spending limitation.

Section 6. Certification. The District's accountant is hereby authorized and directed to immediately certify to the County Commissioners of Denver County, Colorado, the 50.000 mill levy for the District hereinabove determined and set. That said certification shall be in substantially the following form:



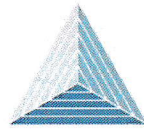

2022 BUDGET MESSAGE

Denver Rock Drill Metropolitan District is a quasi-municipal corporation organized and operated pursuant to the provisions set forth in the Colorado Special District Act. The District was established to provide streets, traffic safety controls, street lighting, sanitary sewer, water, landscaping, storm drainage, mosquito control and park and recreational improvements; and to provide the operation and maintenance of these improvements for the benefit of the landowners and residents of the District.

The District has no employees at this time and all operations and administrative functions are contracted.

The budget is prepared on the modified accrual basis of accounting, which is consistent with the basis of accounting used in presenting the District's financial statements.

In preparing the 2022 budget, the following goals are foremost for the District:

- To provide the level of services desired by the constituents of the District in the most economic manner possible.

Overview

Highlights of the 2022 budget include the following:

- The District was formed in 2018.
- The District will be funded through operating advances in 2022.

General Fund

Revenue

The District's primary source of general fund revenue 2022 are operating advances of \$37,720.

Expenses

The District's General Fund expenditures consist of administrative and operations costs of \$37,720. Major expenses consist of Accounting and District Management at \$11,570 and \$13,000, respectively, and Legal costs of \$7,500.

Fund Balance/Reserves

The District has provided for an emergency reserve fund equal to at least 3% of the fiscal year spending for 2022, as defined under TABOR.
